Wrapped Meatballs (submitted by Joy Elder)



1 bag Italian-style meatballs

2-8 oz. cans refrigerated crescent rolls

1 cup Parmesan cheese, grated (can us pkg. already grated)

2 cups pasts sauce (for dipping)

Thaw meatballs. Set oven temperature as directed on crescent roll package. On an ungreased baking sheet, separate crescent rolls into 8 pieces. Cut each piece in half to form 2 narrow triangles. Place a meatball onto each triangle. Pull up the corners of the roll, wrapping the meatball. Bale for the amount of time stated on the crescent roll package. If desired, sprinkle cheese on wraps while still warm. Serve with pasta sauce for dipping These may be frozen for up to three weeks after baking.
