Joy is recouping nicely from her right hip replacement of Dec 18. She is now going to rehab two times each week with Sophia at Oconee P T and Sports Rehab with a goal of attending the SEC Ladies Basketball Tournament in Greenville SC March 4 - 8.

Sophia was not able to do her therapy for 3 weeks while Joy dealt with a 6-day hospital stay resulting in a diagnosis of 2 bleeding ulcers which took 1/2 of her red blood cells and dropped her hemoglobin down to a reading of 4 when she arrived in the Emergency room on Thursday, Jan. 9 and after lots of scopes, IV drugs and numerous tests, it was determined that the second diagnosis was Heart Failure.

Thanks for heeding the request to not visit or call me for a few days after I returned home on Tuesday, Jan. 14. Texts or messages were fine, but I came home totally exhausted and needed quiet time to get settled down mentally and emotionally. I got at the most 4 hours of constantly interrupted sleep for 5 nights.

I have been uplifted by and am thankful for your hospital visits, flowers, cards, texts messages and prayers. Pilots are special to me in my life and most especially each of you in The Pilot Club of Oconee County....you are THE best.
