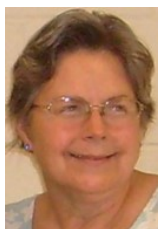

One of the most pressing needs that we can help with is providing staples for their food pantry. Bring some staples with you as you come November 1 and let's fill one, two or three boxes to help restock their shelves.

Suggestions:

1. Diabetic clients: fruit cups, juice boxes and water.
2. Homeless: staples that do not need a lot of preparations (mac and cheese cups, canned meats etc.)
3. General population clients: any staples that your family enjoy. Boxed, bagged or canned.



The 5K raised about \$128,000 with a goal of \$98,500. There were 850 participants and 52 teams. It was a special day for people to come together to show support .
