

Project Lifesaver

The primary mission of Project Lifesaver is to provide timely response to save lives and reduce potential injury for adults and children who wander due to Alzheimer's. Autism. and other related conditions or disorders.

Our Club has 5 Project Lifesaver clients. At the initial visit, the client is assigned a transmitter with a specific tracking frequency. Captain Jimmy Williams of the Oconee County Sheriff's office is in charge of training officers to use the equipment. Once per month, the batteries and bands are replaced.
