There are numerous opportunities to be involved with the Oconee Country Chamber. There will be a sign-up sheet at the meeting 9-4-2018, or we can send it to you.


Be sure and pick up some business cards, only did 200, getting more is not a problem, as long as they are being used and not put in Never Never Land.

Based on the awards given, artists may also have the opportunity to have their artwork displayed in a statewide tour and exhibit.

The awards luncheon is held the third Saturday in September. It is open to any artist in Georgia who is disabled physically, mentally, or emotionally. The artist may submit <u>any</u> form of art. The art is judged by three very reputable and known art afficionados. Awards are given based on technique, creativity, and originality. The winning art then tours throughout the state for a period of one year. At the luncheon and during the tour if the artist chooses, the art can be placed for sale.

It is a wonderful opportunity for the artist to become involved in the community as well as have exposure for his talent.

Cake ingredients:

2 cups plain flour

2 cups sugar

2 eggs

1 teaspoon soda

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 20 oz. can crushed pineapple with juice

Mix ingredients by hand (do not use mixer). Pour into a 9 x 13 pan (do not grease or flour). Bake for 25-30 minutes at 350 degrees or until brown on top. Pour topping over cake while hot. Cool and cover.

Topping ingredients:

1 small can evaporated milk 1 cup chopped pecans 1 cup sugar 1 cup coconut 1 stick butter

Mix sugar, butter and milk and boil 2 minutes. Remove from heat and add nuts and coconut.
