There are only two membership categories for Pilot. You are either a dues paying member or a non-dues-paying member.

Be sure to report your club's volunteer hours. This is important not only so your club can be eligible to apply for awards but it is also important that the IRS can see our volunteer hours so we can keep our 501C3 status. All club members have access to report their volunteer hours by going to the PI website, but you might just want to designate someone in your club to keep up with the volunteer hours and report them monthly or quarterly to PI. The choice is up to your club how you handle this.

Make sure your club recording secretary is using Portalbuzz. They should have received an email from PI with instructions and their access code. Portalbuzz eliminates the need for paper reporting on members, including address changes, membership changes, additions of new members and deletions of members. Each club can designate two people to have access to Portalbuzz and it would be a good idea to have the club President and Secretary designated for access. Most important is that the dues invoices will be sent to the club secretaries this year via Portalbuzz. If you are not using Portalbuzz or did not get your access code, please contact Bonnie Millirans at PI Headquarters, 478-477-1208, or nie@pilothq.org. You can call her or email her.

1/2 cup rice, uncooked

1/2 cup chopped onion

1 pound ground beef

Salt

Pepper

1 1/2 cups tomato juice

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spread half of the cabbage in the bottom of the roasting pan. Sprinkle with salt. Add rice, onion, and meat. Spread remaining cabbage on top.
