Rosa and Freeman were able to visit with their son and daughter-in-law before Christmas. Their daughter was able to spend Christmas with at home with them.




Rosa's Sugar Cookies



- 1 cup sugar
- 1 egg
- 1/2 cup butter, partially melted
- ¹/₄ cup buttermilk
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- $3 \frac{1}{2}$ cups all-purpose flour

Beat egg. Add sugar and butter. Mix soda with buttermilk and add to mixture. Add vanilla and work in just enough flour to handle. Roll dough lightly and cut out cookies. Bake at 400° F. for approximately 10 minutes or until lightly browned.
