The 2018 GPF (Georgia Pilot Foundation) raffle will again be for \$2,000—8 awards of \$250 each. All clubs are being asked to sell a minimum of 40 tickets. Tickets are \$10 each or 4 for \$20, and will be distributed to the Club Presidents at Fall Council. The drawing will be held at the 2018 District Convention.

The raffle proceeds, along with donations, allowed us to award \$13,500 in scholarships for 2017—6 Anchor and 3 Volunteer scholarships. With continuing increases in the cost of tuition for our college students, these scholarships are needed more than ever by these deserving students.





Volunteer Hours is the new name of Service Hours. The time our members spend volunteering for their club, district, or Pilot International are important for our 501(c)(3) status. The hours may also impact grant applications that may be submitted by our organization.

Pilot/Anchor volunteer hours are broken down by the ABC's (initiatives of Pilot International). Hours include the time members dedicate to a service project, a BrainMinders<sup>™</sup> presentation, a safety day or bike rodeo, assisting with an Anchor convention, or presenting a Pick Me Up. You may also include attending a special meeting preparing for one of these activities. In addition, if you volunteer at a community function and represent Pilot International by wearing your Pilot shirt and/ or name tag and promote Pilot, these hours can be included.

Volunteer hours for fundraising events for your club are not included. If you are helping with another organization's fundraiser, those hours can be counted if you are representing your club. An easy way to distinguish this is, if the money from the fundraiser is being deposited in your club's bank account(s), then the hours are NOT included.

Each club should assign one person to submit the volunteer hours for all members of the club monthly. This is done on the Pilot International website. This is a very simple form and takes less than 5 minutes to complete. The data submitted is collected in Survey Monkey. Volunteer hours should be submitted monthly for all members

**Pumpkin Bread** Submitted by Pam Crawford



1 2/3 c all-purpose flour
1 1/2 c sugar
1 tsp baking soda
1 tsp ground cinnamon
3/4 tsp salt
1/2 tsp baking powder
1/2 tsp ground nutmeg
1/4 tsp ground cloves
2 large eggs
1 c canned pumpkin
1/2 c canola oil
1/2 c vater
1/2 c raisins
Optional
1/2 c chopped walnuts

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease 9x5 loaf pan.

Combine first eight ingredients, whisk together eggs, pumpkin, oil and water and stir in dry ingredients just until moistened. Fold in raisins.

Pour into loaf pan and bake 65-70 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.

Cool in pan 10 minutes and remove to cool on wire rack.
