## FROM OUR KITCHENS



#### **LEMON POUND CAKE**

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

2 ½ cups of sugar 1 heaping cup of Crisco 6 eggs 1 cup sweet milk 3 cups plain flour 2 tsp. baking powder ½ tsp. salt 1 tsp. lemon flavoring 1 tsp. vanilla flavoring



#### DIRECTIONS:

Mix sugar and Crisco and beat until fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating after each. Sift flour, baking powder, and salt together and add alternating with milk, then add flavoring. Pour in greased tube pan. Bake at 325 degrees for 1 hour and 5 minutes.

Glaze: Mix 2/3 cup sugar and 1 can frozen lemon juice. Cook for 2 – 3 minutes.

Pour glazed over cooled cake.

Note from Pam: This is an old recipe given to me by former Pilot member Ginger Randall. It was her mother's recipe and a favorite of their family. Enjoy!
